
# **Rising Voices Wessex Annual Survey 2024 - Results**

1a) which choir or choirs did you attend before the merger in October 2023


1b) do you attend the merged choir since October 2023




# Q2. Other (please specify):

# Q3. What attracted you to sing with Rising Voices Wessex choir? (Tick as many as appropriate).



Q4. What best describes your experience with Rising Voices Wessex? (tick as many as appropriate).











- (comment from Q8) Whist most of the songs are fun, I do feel that one or two are not suitable for this choir. People like well known songs that they can join in.
- Love coming to Choir. Perhaps sometimes, consult with the members more on suitable songs to sing. I know we have our say in the surveys, but sometimes new songs are learnt, when in some cases, it might not be appropriate word wise, eg: "Keep the customer satisfied." Appreciate that we should be challenged, but sometimes being over challenged, particularly as we have so few men.
- A few more singalongs
- I've been in Rising Voices with all the three music directors. Their song choices are very different. Some of the songs are too high. It spoils the enjoyment of singing. Not much fun.
- I think some of the unknown songs which are very high could be a bit too challenging for those going through treatment.
- Announce the next song name ASAP to give most time for people to find their song sheet. E.g. before
  other between tunes discussions. ensure that the microphone is used effectively for all announcements
  etc.
- Less chat during the actual practice periods ... seems that sometimes there is unnecessary discussion and time is wasted 🙁
- Practice and perfect songs before performing in public.

- Run a series of workshops as took place in Wimborne. Time to concentrate on breathing techniques and voice control. Concentrating also on coming in together finishing together and dynamics which can take a song to another level. Lots of other things too that we don't have time to concentrate on in 2 hours. Looking happy and animated when both rehearsing and performing.
- A choir nearer to Bmth.
- I am very happy at choir, and my ONLY comment, is that disruptive or negative choir members, who do not conform to the "Code of Contact", should not be tolerated just because they have issues or problems, as this affects the rest of the choir. This is not a problem at present, but could reappear in the future.
- All great, nothing needs changing
- Perhaps set a higher standard.
- Maybe we could have name badges. Joining as a new member and chemo brain my memory for names is not brilliant.
- · Basically nothing as I appreciate all the effort made for the choir
